An elderly lady was amazed at how nice the young man was next door. Everyday he would help her gather things from her car or help her in her yard. One day the woman finally asked the young man, "Son, how did you become such a fine young man?"

The neighbor replied, "Well, when I was a boy, I had a drug problem."

The old lady was shocked, "I can't believe that!"

The young man replied, "It's true, my parents <u>drug</u> me to church on Sunday morning, <u>drug</u> me to church on Sunday night and <u>drug</u> me to church on Wednesday night!"

There are a lot of good reasons for worship to be a regular part of your life (even beyond God's command):

1. WORSHIPPING EACH WEEK IS IMPORTANT BECAUSE JESUS IS ALIVE.

We go to worship each week <u>because Jesus is alive</u>. Jesus rose from the dead on a Sunday morning. As the news spread, his disciples spent that whole day telling each other the story and talking about what it all meant. They named it "The Lord's Day." It was a powerful way to spend the day, so they decided to do it again the next week. And every week ever since, for two thousand years.

So, think of it like your birthday. The day you were born is so special to the people who love you that they celebrate it every year. The day Jesus rose from the dead is so special to people who love him that we celebrate it every single week.

2. WORSHIP IS IMPORTANT BECAUSE WE WANT TO REMEMBER AND PRACTICE THE GOSPEL.

Some words are easier to learn than others. No one needs to teach us words like "mine" and "no!" But other words are more difficult, and take a lot of time to learn — words like "Thank you" and "I'm sorry."

Church is a place where we practice these words in the most important ways. We can see our sin and what it means, we can feel regret in our hearts and say, "God, I'm sorry for sinning against you." We can hear his words of forgiveness to us and say, "Thank you, Jesus, for saving me."

Interestingly, learning those words makes words like "mine" and "no!" — harder and harder to say.

I remember hearing how Dr. Norman Neaves and his wife Kipp were leading a group on a tour of England, and one of the stops was St. Paul's Cathedral in London. It's an awesome structure, even more beautiful on the inside than it is impressive on the outside.

Standing there admiring the beautiful artwork, Kipp found herself standing next to an elderly British gentleman. He was looking up at the magnificent dome of St. Paul's and tears were running down his wrinkled cheeks. After a moment he turned and said: "I live less than 20 miles from here, and yet this is the first time I've ever come into this cathedral since I moved here over 50 years ago!" He just could not imagine how beautiful and inspiring it really was, and so for 50 years he had denied himself the exquisite experience, even though he was so close.

DON'T DENY YOURSELF THE GIFT OF WORSHIP!

You're probably not 20 miles away. **Engage your heart**. **Encounter the presence of God.** Change your life. And bear fruit for the Kingdom. I hope to see you in worship on Sunday!






